Insiders' Tips on Making Your Visit More Pleasant

The following suggestions are offered to make your stay in Tokyo Disneyland a more pleasant and enjoyable experience.

■ Attractions

The best time to visit the most popular Tokyo Disneyland attractions is either in the morning or just before Park closing.

Each of our themed lands can be glimpsed from the Plaza in front of Cinderella Castle. Use this location as a point of reference, and our guidebook to help you decide on your day's activities.

If an attraction you wish to see has an unusually long line, try later in the day. In the meantime, you can visit another attraction or relax at one of our free entertainment shows.



■Dining

Dining will be an important part of your visit to Tokyo Disneyland. To help you enjoy the special atmosphere of each themed land, a variety of unique food facilities are located throughout the Park. Since all our restaurants will be busy during the traditional lunch and dinner hours, we suggest you plan your dining to avoid these peak times. For an extra treat, popcorn and ice cream are available at outdoor stands in each land.

■ Shopping

Guests will enjoy browsing through the carefully-themed shops located throughout Tokyo Disneyland. For your convenience, plan to shop in the morning or early afternoon to avoid the rush at closing time. Packages may be left in the Storage Lockers near the Main Entrance and picked up as you exit the Park.

Colorful Mickey Mouse balloons are also available in several outdoor locations.

■Parades and Shows

Disney parades and special shows are presented daily in Tokyo Disneyland. During periods of peak attendance, we advise you to secure your viewing place at least 30 minutes before the scheduled start time.

■ Readmittance to Tokyo Disneyland

To leave the Park and return later during the same operating day, have your hand stamped at the Main Entrance as you exit.

If you traveled by car, be sure to retain your parking ticket. This will enable you to re-park free of charge if you leave the parking lot and return on the same day.
